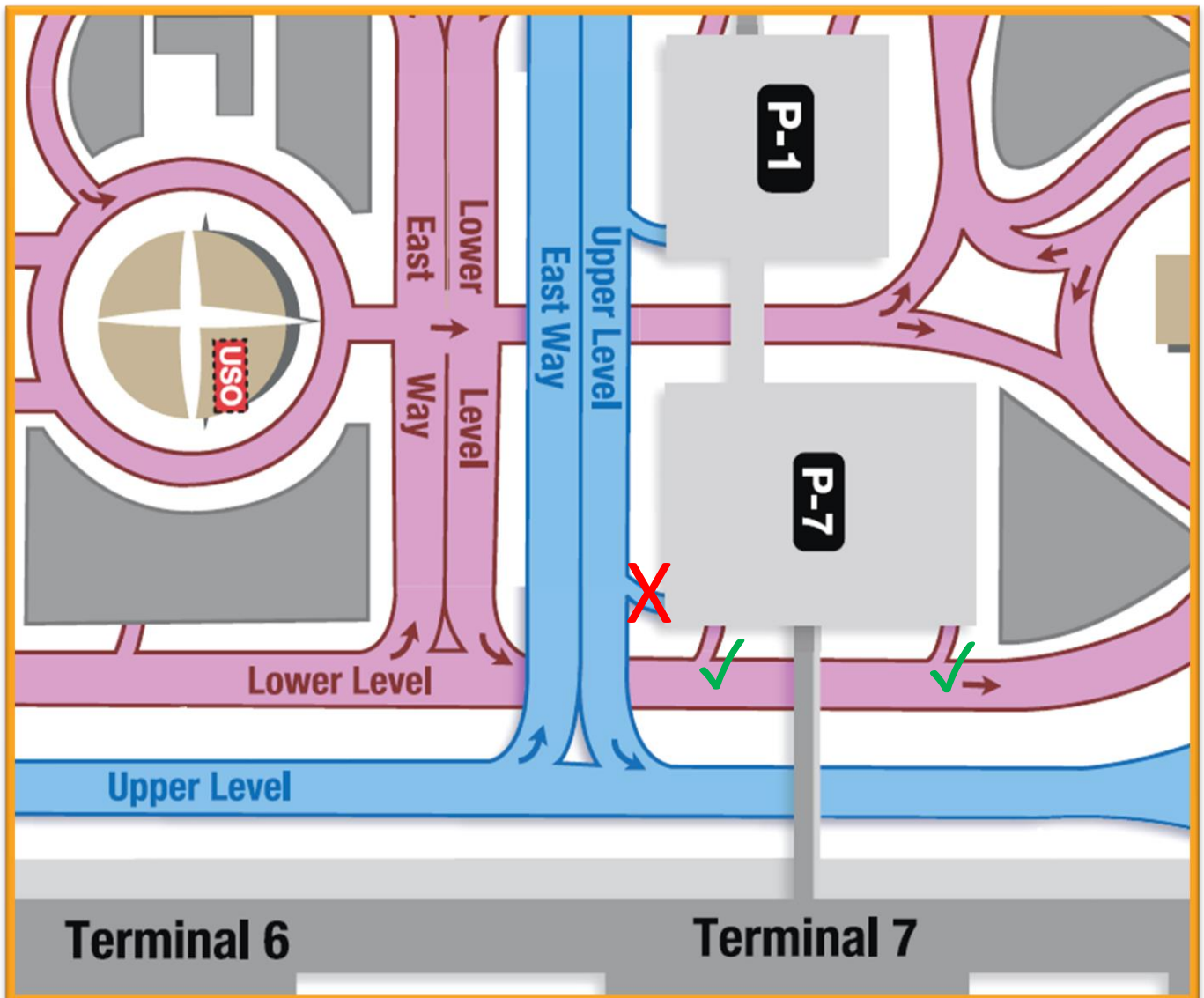

1. Parking Structure 7: Departures Entrance Closed

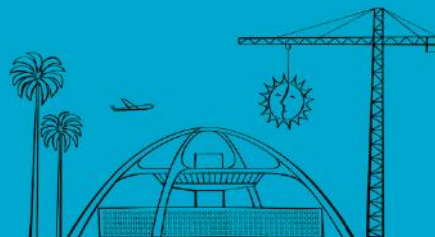
- To facilitate work for the ABM Smart Parking CTA Garage Improvements project, the Departures Level entrance to Parking Structure 7 will be closed 24/7 through Friday, September 2, 2022
- Vehicles will be able to access the Parking Structure from the Arrivals Level entrance off World Way South near Terminal 7
- Guests are reminded that they can make reservations and pre-book parking for LAX Parking Structures at parking.flylax.com



The Departures Level entrance to Parking Structure 7 will be closed 24/7 through September 2; both entrances on the Arrivals Level remain open

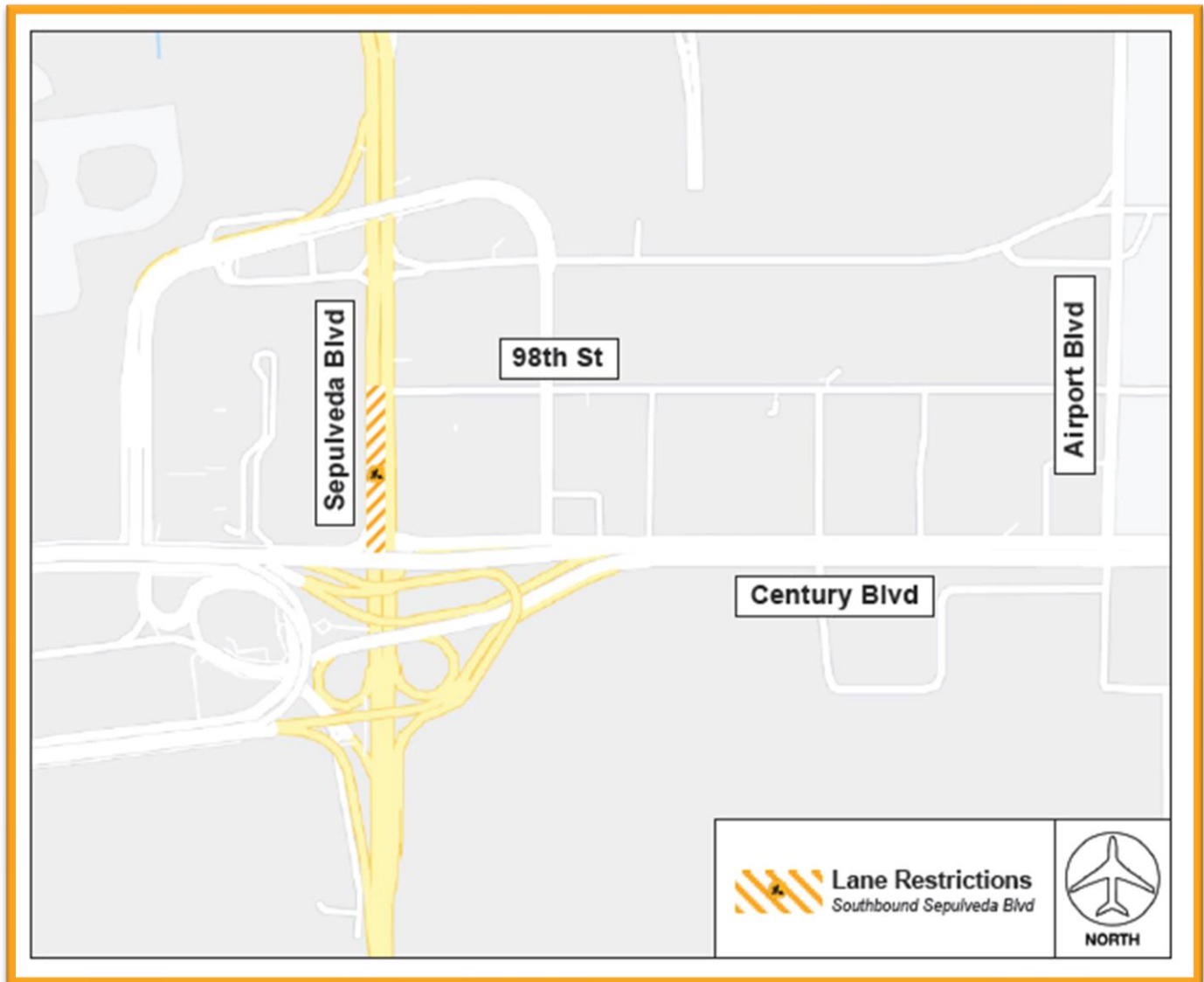

2. Roadway Impacts: Sepulveda Boulevard near LAX

- To facilitate work for the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power Trunk Line Project, southbound lanes on Sepulveda Boulevard between 98th Street and Century Boulevard will be reduced through February 2023
- Work is scheduled to be performed nightly, Monday through Friday from 9PM to 5AM
- Traffic will be maintained at all times; motorists should plan ahead for potential delays accessing LAX from southbound Sepulveda Boulevard during this time



Southbound Sepulveda Boulevard between 98th Street and Century Boulevard will experience lane reductions through February 2023

3. Terminal 4.5: Roadway Impacts & Construction Progress

- Construction continues at Terminal 4.5 (the area between Terminals 4 and 5) on construction of the Terminal Vertical Core that will connect to the Automate People Mover's West CTA Station, as well as additional construction as part of the American Airlines Modernization Program
- Curbside barricades on both levels are scheduled to start being removed in early September, after which the temporary sidewalks and protective pedestrian canopies will also be removed and roadway lanes restored for use by vehicles
